How we **stay OK** on the **computer**:

- **Treat** people how you would **like** to be treated.
- Keep **personal** information **private**.
- Be careful of people you don't know on the **internet**.
They might be **pretending** to be someone else.
- Don't arrange to **meet** up with someone you have met
online.
- Don't tell **strangers** where you **live**, your phone
number or where you go to **school**.
- Never **post** your phone number or address online.
- Don't send **photos** of yourself to **people** you don't know.
- If you ever feel **uncomfortable** or scared about
something on the computer, tell an **adult**.
- If someone is mean to you on the computer,
don't **reply** but do tell an adult so they can make it stop.
- Use your **privacy** settings on **social media** to make
sure people you don't know can't find out personal
information about you.
- Don't **download** anything without speaking to your
parents first.
